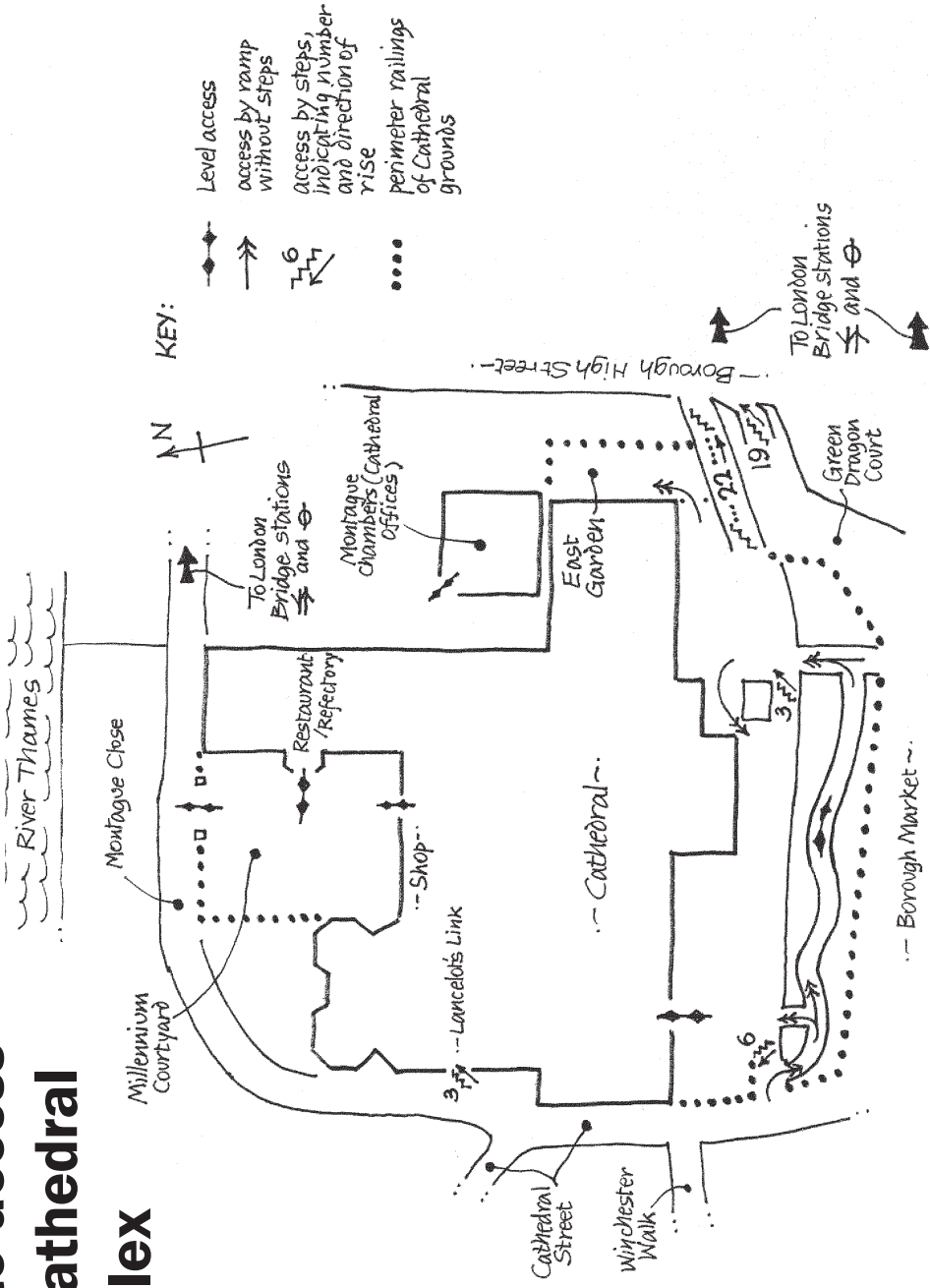
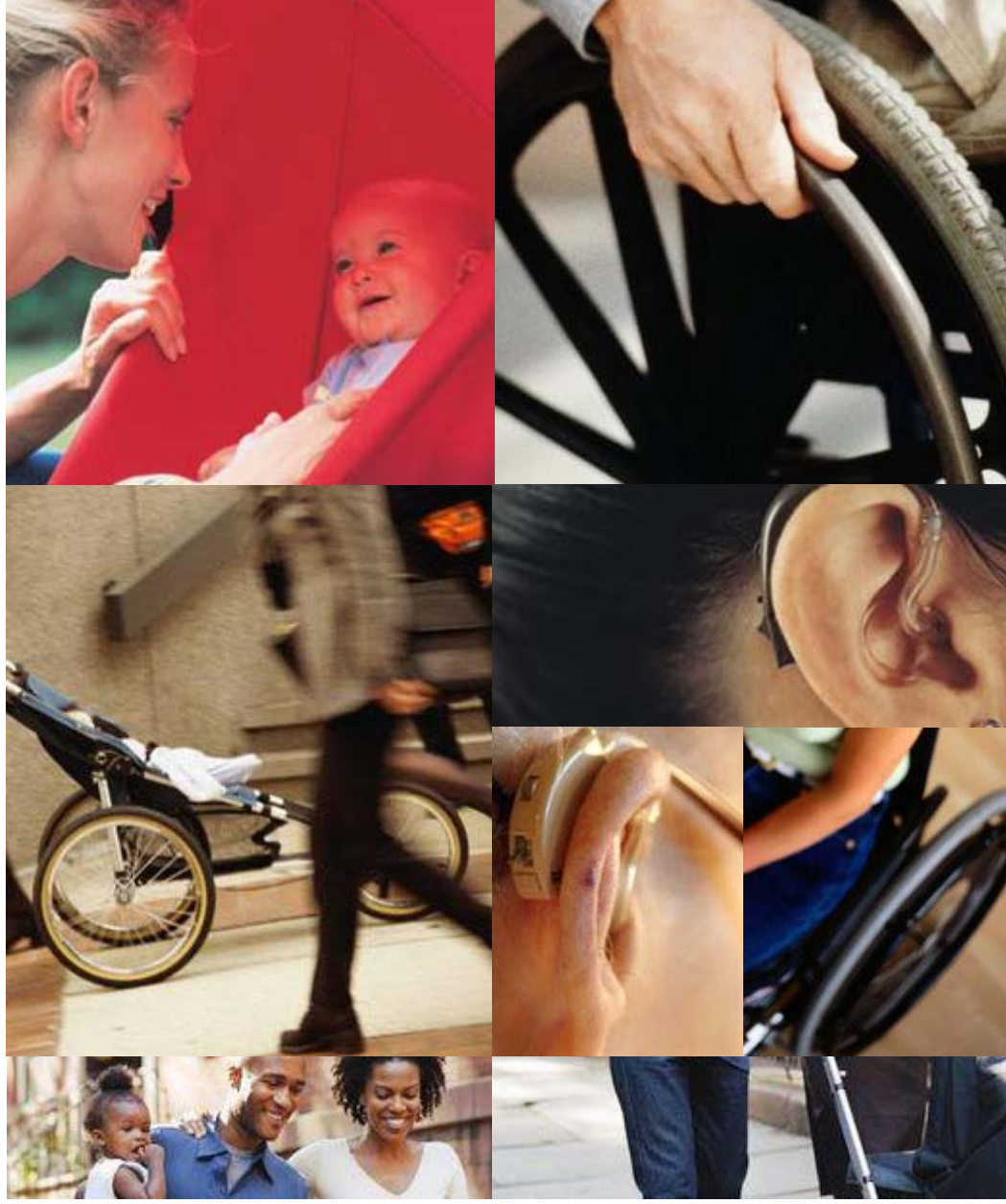


How to access the Cathedral complex



Access for people with special needs

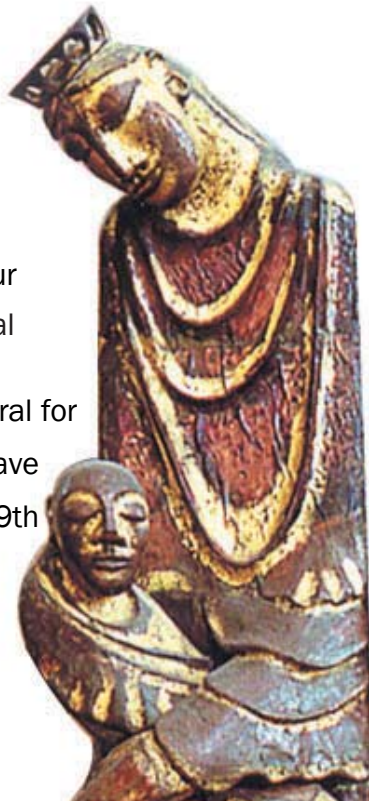


Welcome

A church has stood on the site of Southwark Cathedral for over 1,000 years. Originally a convent, it is said to have been founded as a Monastery by St Swithun in the 9th century. 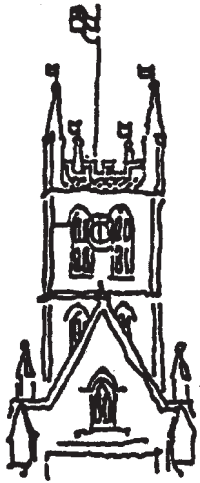

distinction of being the first 'gothic' church to be built in London and much of that early work can still be seen in the choir and retro-choir of the present church.

Early in 2001 a northern "cloister" was opened by Nelson Mandela where once the monastic cloister stood. There is a shop which sells a range of books, cards, gifts, and souvenirs that relate to the Cathedral's history. There is also a Refectory/Restaurant which sells hot and cold meals, sandwiches, cakes, teas, coffees and cold drinks. The complex also houses a library and conference rooms. The churchyard has been landscaped as a green space at the heart of the city.
