CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

The Bishop of Southwark

One of the most heartening scenes in the Church's year is the cheerful throng converging from all quarters for the Midnight Mass. All are welcome to cross the threshold into this light at any time of year, but particularly so on this night of nights when we shall gather once more to welcome "all wonders in one sight, eternity shut in a span, summer in winter, day in night." Now, as she has for a hundred and twelve years as a Cathedral, and for many generations as a Parish Church and Priory, Southwark Cathedral prepares to open her doors and turn on her lights. Christmas is a focal point of the Cathedral's ministry of welcome, of care and concern for one and all. This year, those lights and those open doors will have an extra, sombre resonance. For as we all painfully recall, the Cathedral was at the centre of terrible atrocities committed on the night of 3rd June, when eight people were killed and forty-eight injured on London Bridge and in Borough Market and many more were traumatised and drawn into the unfolding horror of it all. The Police had to search every building to make sure no terrorists were hiding, and were forced to break through the Cathedral doors. Carpenters and glaziers have been busy this Autumn, but the old oak door of the Vestry still bears the scars of forced entry - in which we may see a faint reflection of the Risen Christ bearing the marks of his passion.

For a week the Cathedral was off limits inside the crime scene cordon, doors shut and lights dark. The life of prayer continued: the Diocesan Pentecost Service was relocated to St Mark's Kennington, the Daily Office and celebration of the Eucharist to St Hugh's Church and the Chapel of Guy's Hospital. And on regaining access we re-hallowed the Cathedral as well as the adjacent market and streets. I do not know when last a Cathedral had to close her doors in this way. All the more reason to turn on the lights and open the doors with an undaunted spirit of Advent and Christmas welcome, proclaiming boldly that the light shines in the darkness and the darkness does not overcome it.

Lately I have often recalled the words of the Parish Priest of St Clement's, Notting Dale, where Grenfell Tower stood and stands. Asked what he did when awakened in the small hours of that terrible night, he said "I went to the Church, I opened the doors and I turned on the lights." Within a few hours St Clement's Church was the centre of a humanitarian relief operation, offering Christ's holy hospitality to all in need. And that, though thank God not always at moments of such crisis, is what the Cathedral Church has striven to do for so long: to open the doors and turn on the lights and welcome all people.

It would not be able to do this without the stalwart support of the Friends. In this year when all have sensed peril, menace and anxiety, this ministry of open doors that you make possible is more necessary than ever. I

want to express my personal appreciation for the Friends of Southwark Cathedral, giving generously a most precious gift: love, time, skill and treasure to sustain this Cathedral Church and its ministry.

May you have a Blessed and Joyful Christmas and may the light of Christ shine on you in the Coming Year through the open doors of Heaven.
