BUSY AGAIN

It's good to be busy again this spring and we have lots to look forward to as Friends. A group of us have already begun our 'piecemeal pilgrimage' to Canterbury – postponed twice since 2020 and now taking place in 'legs' every third Saturday of the month. We set off from the Cathedral on January 15th, with our pilgrim blessing given by Canon Andrew Zihni, and ended the day with a last look back at London from the crest of Shooter's Hill.



In February we walked from Shooter's Hill to Erith, and in March we follow the river to Dartford. Our April walk is on Holy Saturday, April 16th, when we will be walking from Dartford to Otford. Start and end points are accessible by train so do join us if you can for an Easter outing. Walks are suitable for the family, as my 9-year-old will attest, but do get in touch with the office if you have any concerns.

You will know that Southwark Cathedral is now a member of the Community of the Cross

of Nails and on 28th May we deepen that connection with a trip to Coventry Cathedral. We'll have a tour and the opportunity to attend the Litany of Reconciliation at noon. In the afternoon we will be visiting the Peace & Reconciliation gallery at the nearby Herbert Museum to find out more about the art created for the cathedral that rose from the ashes. We hope you will be able to join us. We're planning a Friends trip to Dresden next year, world peace permitting, and this visit will lay some foundations for that journey together.

On 11th June for Open Garden Squares weekend we have a pop-up café at the Deanery. If you're able to lend a hand or offer a cake to sell we would be most grateful. Please contact the office.

Walks

Lots of chatting and encouragement as we walked along tackling fallen trees which had been blown over the previous day in the high winds courtesy of Storm Eunice.
