

From the Bishop

This year we are approaching Christmas in a way that is almost a return to normal. Although the challenges of the pandemic remain, the Cathedral has planned a full programme of services. There will be carolling and joy and, after all the preparations of Advent, the Christ-child will be born anew for us as we encounter him in the first Eucharist of Christmas. To prepare in this way is, in many ways, an act of faith. For none of us knows whether the arrangements we make will need to change, or whether what we plan will be cancelled. We are fragile parts of a fragile ecosystem—contingent—dependent on so many things. Yet each of us has the capacity for growth and for maturity, for hope and for fulfilment of hope. And so we prepare in faith for what God has in store.

There can hardly have been less propitious births than Christ's. Even his mother's journey to the place of birth was fraught. But there he lay—there he lies—the exemplar of contingency, dependent on his blessed mother for

food, on a stranger for a cot, on God for his humanity. This was the moment of which prophets sang, and for which they longed. This tiny child, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory for God's people Israel, this tiny child is God incarnate—a true sign of hope. The Christ-child is a sign of hope because in Christ God says, 'it will not always be this way'. Instead God says, 'Behold I am doing a new thing! Do you not perceive it?' In Christ all things will conform eventually to their purpose in God because the unchanging God took our changeable humanity and moved us firmly into the stability of the Divine life by submitting himself to the changes and chances of this fleeting world: a mother for food, a stranger for a cot. This Advent and Christmas I invite you to join the Dean and Chapter on the journey to the manger—a journey of faith, a journey of hope. A journey in which we encounter the source of our fulfilment and subsequent maturity. I am grateful, as we approach the end of the year, to the Dean and Chapter, and the wider Cathedral family, for sustaining the Mother Church of our Diocese through the challenges of what has almost been two years

of Covid. Their faith and hope and resilience and professionalism have ensured that Southwark Cathedral enters 2022 in good heart and robust shape. The Friends have played their part, too, and I express my thanks to you all for holding faith with the Cathedral in prayer and generosity. May God bless you and those you love with peace and joy this Christmas and throughout the coming year. And may your encounter with the Christ-child teach us how dependent we are on each other, and lead us into growth and maturity, into hope and the fulfilment of that hope, as we learn what God has prepared for those who love him.

From the Dean


I always get terribly excited at this time of the year. Christmas is on the horizon and there is a whole list of things to be done but at the end of that long list - cards, presents, food and the rest - there is Christmas itself with all of its joys. In many ways it's a journey we make and that is behind the idea of my latest book, 'Bethlehem Bound'. There were so many people on a journey, making their way to this little town in the Judean hills. Like any set of travellers they have their own story to tell, their own reason for travelling, their own purpose in

making Bethlehem their destination, the goal of their journey.

My book is a devotional companion, a guide from 17 December - the day the church calls 'O Sapientia', to the Feast of the Epiphany and beyond. For each day there is both a reflection on the gospel read at the Eucharist that day and also an introduction to one of the many characters in the nativity story. My hope is that each reader will be drawn into the joy and the deep significance, life-changing significance, of the incarnation.

I was delighted when the Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, commended the book with this comment, "Bethlehem Bound offers us an opportunity to enter into the nativity and its rich tapestry of characters in a fresh and engaging way. Andrew Nunn takes us on a pilgrimage into this most familiar of stories and in his gentle way encourages us to see something new." I hope that it helps you make a good Christmas journey to the manger.

A talk with John Vigar

Saturday 4 February 2023, 2.30pm
 Murder, Sex and Mayhem in English Churches

Like most people John enjoys the peace and serenity offered by our parish churches, but having visited and recorded over 12,000 of them he has found they also contain countless images of Murder, Sex and Mayhem. Medieval murals and stained glass depict the martyrdom of saints from home and abroad, and the grisliest of dooms. At a lower level may be found

misericords showing whippings, wife beatings and brawls.

Finally there are many monuments and memorials that show scenes of murder and mayhem in goodly measure including stagecoach crashes, bridge collapses, falling trees, falling bridges, falling chimneys, shootings, stabbings, mine collapses, shipwrecks and explosions. This illustrated lecture will show a selection of images of murder and mayhem from across the country and explain both the stories behind them and their relevance to particular periods of history.

John Vigar has been described as "one of the most popular commentators on English history"

John lectured for the University of Kent from 1992 to 2010, teaching a variety of architectural and social history studies, and has worked on a sessional basis for many other academic institutions. In addition to his contracted lectures John is a popular speaker at meetings of many different groups including The Arts Society (NADFAS), the National Trust, and historical societies country-wide.
