

Pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi

2-9 March 2026

'After I have been to Jerusalem, I must also see Rome' (Paul, Acts 19:21).

This comprehensive programme of sightseeing offers the opportunity to take part in this great celebration of faith. During a jubilee, the opening of the Holy Doors is one of the main rituals symbolising the offering of an "extraordinary path" toward salvation. We walk through the Holy Doors of the four papal basilicas of Rome before heading to Assisi, the medieval town home of St Francis, set amidst the peace and tranquillity of the Umbrian countryside. Our visits include the twin Basilica of St Francis, the church of St Clare, Santa Maria degli Angeli, the peaceful Hermitage, which was a place of retreat and meditation for Francis as well as San Damiano where St Francis received the message from the Crucifix to repair God's church and where, later, St Clare founded her community.

We invite you to join us on this pilgrimage which promises to be a spiritually enriching experience.

TOUR INFORMATION

The price for this 8 day tour is £2,150 per person.based on sharing a double or twin-bedded room and includes all excursions and most expenses. A number of single rooms are available for a supplement from £360.

OUR PILGRIMAGE

Monday 2 March | TO ROME

Meet your fellow pilgrims at the London Airport and check-in for your direct morning flight to Rome. On arrival meet your local Tour Manager and check-in at the Pinewood Hotel for a four-night stay. Dinner at the hotel.

Tuesday | CLASSICAL ROME

Today start your tour at the Colosseum set beside the Palatine Hilll, the Via Sacra the Roman Forum and Arch of Titus. Stop for an included lunch in a local restaurant. Continue through the Medieval Quarter to explore sites such as the magnificent Piazza Navona, built on the site where the Stadium of Domitian (86 AD) once stood, with its three ornate fountains. Also see the Pantheon, the best-preserved ancient building in the city, this former Roman temple is a marvel of architectural harmony and proportion. After, visit the Basilica of San Giorgio in Velabro where according to history, the Roman story began. Then finally, visit the Basilica of Santa Sabina the oldest ecclesiastical basilica in Rome that preserves its original colonnaded rectangular plan with apse and architectural style. At the hotel we have a dinner together.

Wednesday | The Early Christians Drive part of the Via Appa Antica, one of the most famous ancient roads. It was built in 312 B.C. by Appius Claudius Caecus. In its entirety it spanned 350 miles (563kms) stretching from the Roman Forum to modern day Brindisi. It allowed trade and access to the east, specifically Greece and is the route Peter and Paul would have taken to enter Rome. Then visit The Catacombs of Domitilla, the underground cemetery developed between the 2nd and 3rd centuries AD. A semi-underground basilica built at the end of the fourth century during the pontificate of Pope Damasus. After free after time for lunch (at own cost) drive back to Rome passing the Church of Domine Quo Vadis to the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, marking the spot where Paul was buried. Finally, visit the of Saint John in Lateran (San Giovanni in Laterano) is defined as "the mother of all churches in the world." You will visit the museum, which collects precious liturgical furnishings, sculptures, and ornaments. Eucharist followed by Dinner at the hotel.

Thursday | The Vatican City

The Vatican Museum is home to a collection of roughly 70,000 works, including some of the most prominent Roman sculptures and Renaissance paintings amassed by the Catholic Church and the papacy over the centuries. Of these, only 20,000 are on display. To accommodate such a large number of artworks, the Vatican City has created 54 galleries that have come to be known as the Vatican Museums which includes the Sistine Chapel.

After free time for lunch, we take a guided tour of St. Peter's Basilica. Consecrated in 1626 several renowned architects designed the temple, highlighting the works of Bramante, Michelangelo and Carlo Maderno. Study extremely impressive pieces of art, including St. Peter's Baldachin, a large bronze baldachin designed by Bernini, The Pietà, a sculpture by Michelangelo and the statue of St Peter on his throne. St. Peter has his right foot worn down due to the touches of the devoted. You will also see the tombs of several popes including John Paul II. Eucharist together followed by Dinner at the hotel.

Friday | Santa Maria degli Angeli Journey through the hills of Umbria towards Assisi. On arrival stop in the large piazza dominated by the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli. The church was designed by the architect Galeazzo Alessi in collaboration with Vignola. A gold statue of the Madonna stands out against the sky on the top of the church. After free time for lunch, continue to Assisi and in the mid-afternoon check-in to the Hotel Castello for a three-night stay. The remainder of the afternoon is free to relax or wander and enjoy the architecture and views. Dinner in the hotel.

Saturday | Assisi - St. Francis Basilica, Old Town and Basilica of St Clare

We will have a Eucharist together then a guided tour of the Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi. Divided into two parts: one is known as the "lower church", built in the rock on one side of Mount Subiaso between 1228 and 1230, and the other as the "upper church", built above it between 1230 and 1253, in the Gothic style. The two churches, united under the same name of "basilica", have been

listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites since 2000. The body of St. Francis was secretly transferred to the crypt in 1230 and was so well hidden that it was only rediscovered in 1818. After free time for lunch, we take a walking tour of the Old Town including the New Church (Chiesa Nuova), built on the site of St Francis' house. After, continue to the basilica of St Clare is built in the second half of the 13th century. Three large flying buttresses characterize the construction. The interior is simple and bare. A flight of steps leads down to the Crypt, which contains the mortal remains of St. Clare. The chapel of the Crucifix contains the famous Byzantine crucifix (12th century), which, according to the tradition, is supposed to have spoken to St Francis in the church of St Damian. Dinner in the

Sunday | The Eremo Delle Carceri & San Damiano

Journey above Assisi to the architectural complex called "Hermitage of Carceri" developed around a grotto in which Saint Francis of Assisi used to retreat in order to pray. The Hermitage of Carceri is a place of memory, kept alive by the Franciscan friars who still live there; and a place of witness, as well, permeated with spirituality. After, continue to San Damiano, a church with a monastery built in the 12th century and was where Saint Clare built her community. They do permit worship here and we will pause at this spot for reflection. Free time for lunch and to explore the Old Town of Assisi, its wonderful architecture, hillside views as well as soaking in its unique atmosphere. We will have a Eucharist together followed by Dinner in the hotel.

Monday 9 March | HOME

We depart for Rome Fiumicino Airport after breakfast. Our return British Airways flight departs Rome in the afternoon and arrives into London in the early evening

Please note the itinerary may be subject to change due to local conditions and flights can also be subject to alteration.

There will be some walking on this pilgrimage, these historic sights are best explored on foot. Please call the McCabe office for advice if you are at all concerned.
